V. Consent Agenda and Approval of Minutes

Minutes from previous meeting were approved via email and posted to the website/app. Ben motioned to approve the updated agenda: Aimee seconded the motion. Motion unanimously approved. Agenda approved.
VI. Board Reports
A. PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Ben - End of the year is quickly approaching. Summer PAF meetings are important as we plan for and finalize budgets, committees, confirm PAF position terms, etc. Dates TBD via separate email based on everyone's schedules.
B. PRINCIPAL'S REPORT: Evelyn - Yes, end of year....very busy already. Prop 28 bringing more arts to school survey coming soon. Testing and ongoing education keeping all busy.
C. TREASURER'S REPORT: Sean - Finalizing complete exit from Wells Fargo account (to close out savings account need to go in person). At this point of year, riding out budgets...and starting planning for next year. Officially exceeded family giving target of 120k. Carnival is separate (92k vs target of 70k). Open budget still in place for Kermese, staff appreciation etc.
VII. Updates, Discussion, and Action Items
A. Safe Routes to School: Tina/Sarah - County wide program, serving 60 schools, trying to get students to walk, bike, scoot or skate to school safely. Also, new engineering aspects and
community connections. In SoCo, on road transport is $67 \%$ of what causes greenhouse gas emissions and biggest contributors are single family/cars (statewide is $41 \%$ but we are more rural). Health, pollution reasons. Hard for SRFACS due to charter and students living farther away. Consider if you can carpool, park a distance away or park near, run other errands and coordinate for less driving etc. At SRFACS: 10\% walk, $6 \%$ bike and $83 \%$ drive, $20 \%$ live within 1 mile and $45 \%$ live within 2 miles. Santa Rosa Safe Routes to school task meets regularly and parents invited to attend. Site Assessments are performed on each school and SRFACS assessment likely next year and from there they can advise on how we can specifically improve our efforts. They also offer education such as $4^{\text {th }}$ and $5^{\text {th }}$ grade lessons, family workshops (how to ride safely on the road), and safe driving.
Bikesonoma.org/familyworkshops for more info. Bike-to-school day is May 8: posters and swag for event will arrive soon. We can organize meet up spots for bike trains (previously was at Johnny Doughnuts) and publish who is the leader, where and when to meet - entire guide exists we can reference for step-by-step instructions. Now is time to start planning bike train for Bike-to-School day. All materials are posted on site and Tina can also be contacted for more personal assistance.
B. LCAP Discussion: Evelyn - Come to end of 3 yr LCAP plan (Local Accountability Plan needs to be updated ev. 3 yrs ), based on unduplicated students which are ESL, Underprivileged, Homeless...provides additional hours for TOSA, Aides since we require additional resources. New requirements are anything that we are in the red on needs to be addressed in action plan and we are red on absences. Inc. Slater so if a Slater student is absent, contact Cheryl. Chronic absenteeism is 10 days or more of unexcused absence (if you call and you're sick, it's excused, whereas if you're absent due to skiing, not excused). This is super important and tied to not only funding but could affect school standing wrt teacher visas etc, and also students report increased stress and anxiety after missing school. Discussion around how to communicate, measure, class rewards, poster at front, etc. Data on CA Dept. of Education dashboard. We all need to communicate, educate, and influence the school community to ensure kids are in school.
